## **THE DNAA 'LOGICAL' LEAGUE 2008-2009**

For the Winter Season of 2007-2008 the DNAA ran an Archery League aimed at encouraging novice, improver or recreational archers to engage in tournament shooting.

This was extremely successful and it is their intention to run the League again this season.

Although the initial concept was for archers as outlined above there were experienced shooters who wished to join in and the league was extended to cover all abilities but remember that it is a league and you will be in a division commensurate with your level of competence.

A Round is limited to **three dozen** scoring arrows, which must be shot **consecutively** at the **same** session from a distance of 20 yards at a 60cm face, ten-zone scoring. (There is provision for a shorter distance but this would not be applicable at Cleadon (BCA) Archers)

Multiple entries are allowed if you wish to shoot in more than one bow-style.

The League is for individual archers, not teams.

For 2008/2009 the League will cover five periods: October, November, December/January, February and March.

December and January count as one period due to holidays.

Registration can be at any time after the October start date, which allows Beginners, fresh from a Beginners Course, to join in.

Registration can be made via the DNAA web site but, to simplify matters, Bill Lee is prepared to accept registration details and submit them en-bloc as a Club. It is preferable for this to be completed before the 1<sup>st</sup> October.

From October 1<sup>st</sup> you can start shooting and collecting scores. Remember to count your best **three consecutive dozens** from the **same** session.

Keep a record of these and at the end of the first period pass your **best** score for the month to Bill for submission to the League Organiser, Tony George.

Continue to do this for each period throughout the winter season up to the end of March '09.

The League Organiser divides your score by 5 to give you your League Points. If the remainder is greater than 3 you gain an extra point. The scores are then entered into the League Tables and can be viewed at [www.dnaa.co.uk](http://www.dnaa.co.uk) following the 'Logical League' link.

There are seven divisions in the League with a 'score range' for three dozen arrows. Use the table below as a guide in assessing the division you should fit into when first registering.

The table shows the seven divisions each with an upper and lower score range limit.

The lower line shows the threshold set for the division.

For example, in the 'Evesham' league, repeated scores above 229 would result in promotion to the 'Crecy' league.

Alternatively, repeated scores below 181 would result in relegation to the 'Hastings' league.

Scores within 187 to 222 would be classed as normal.

There are no trophies or prizes but all competitors completing two months of the league will receive a Certificate.

It would be encouraging to see all our Shooting Members and, in particular, our newer members engaging in this League.

Enter your details on the form on the Notice Board and, if you are not sure which division to enter, use the next few Indoor sessions to shoot some practice rounds to establish a score for three-dozen arrows.
